Revision: Present tenses

Simple present

Das simple present verwendest du, wenn du allgemeingültige Aussagen machst und wenn du sagen willst, dass jemand etwas regelmäßig tut oder wie häufig er oder sie es tut. Signalwörter every always usually often sometimes never
